
Cemetery is the Fulton Cemetery. The original Fulton Mechanics Cemetery was located downstream in the settlement of Fulton. In 1838 land in Columbia was purchased from Nicholas Longworth for \$120.00. Most of the graves in this cemetery date from the 1840's and 1850's, a few extend into the early 1860's.

The nation's first Purple Heart recipient, Sargent William Brown, is buried here. He was honored by his service in the Revolutionary War by George Washington on May 3, 1783.




