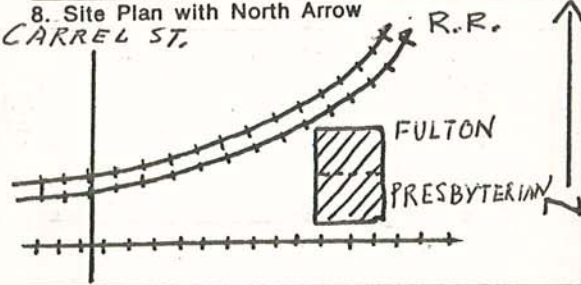

42. Further Description of Important Features  
This abandoned plat of land contains two cemeteries, the Columbia Presbyterian Cemetery and the Fulton Cemetery. There are approximately 150 graves in the cemetery, although far fewer than this number have monuments. Those that do are heavily damaged from exposure or vandalism. Many of the markers face south, and a small plot demarcated by stone pillars is located in the center of the cemetery.



43. History and Significance  
The Columbia Presbyterian Cemetery is among the oldest in the city of Cincinnati. The Columbia First Presbyterian Church was founded on October 16, 1790. The Presbyterian Cemetery contains an 1804 tombstone and is mentioned in an 1804 manuscript. Other stones are dated 1824, 1825, and 1828, the remaining tombstones dating from the 1830's and 1840's. 44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings  
This cemetery is in rapidly deteriorating condition, the majority of the markers broken or hidden in the undergrowth. Remnants of a wrought iron fence that extended around the perimeter of the cemetery are visible. The cemetery is surrounded by a railroad, a dump, and the Cincinnati water works.

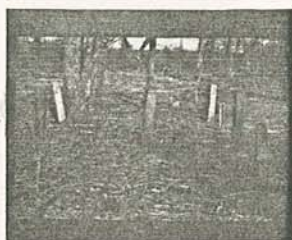

Cemetery is the Fulton Cemetery. The original Fulton Mechanics Cemetery was located downstream in the settlement of Fulton. In 1838 land in Columbia was purchased from Nicholas Longworth for \$120.00. Most of the graves in this cemetery date from the 1840's and 1850's, a few extend into the early 1860's.

The nation's first Purple Heart recipient, Sargent William Brown, is buried here. He was honored by his service in the Revolutionary War by George Washington on May 3, 1783.



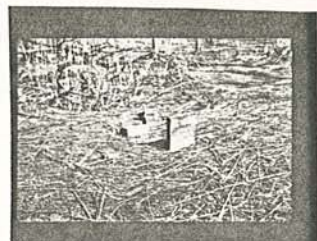

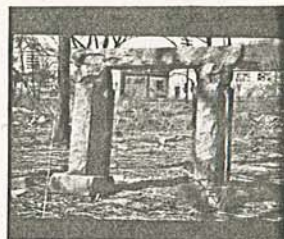
Stone posts in center

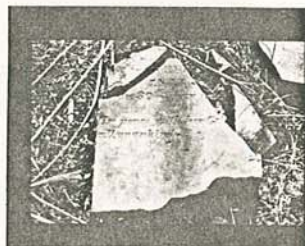
Granite arch in

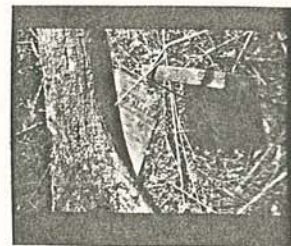

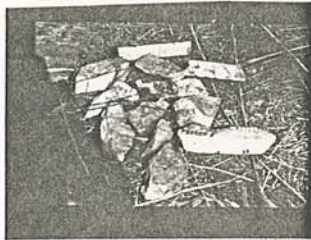
