The Cincinnati Preservation Association Preservation Awards are changing a bit in our 60th year. Cincinnati Preservation Association is elevating the celebration of the amazing preservation work that is happening in the Greater Cincinnati Region. Previously held at the end of the year, we are going to have an awards celebration in May, for National Preservation Month as well as our Anniversary Month as the organization was founded on May 5, 1964.

2024 Preservation Awards Submission Guidelines

Eligibility

- Projects must meet one of the award category requirements.
- Projects must be completed within the last three years.
- The project must be within the counties:
 - Ohio- Hamilton, Clermont, Butler and Warren
 - Indiana- Dearborn and Ohio
 - Kentucky- Boone, Kenton and Campbell

Submission Process

- Payment of entry fee on the Cincinnati Preservation Association website.
www.cincinnati-preservation.org/awards
 - Members: \$100 (fee includes one complimentary ticket to the Preservation Awards Celebration)
 - Non-Members \$125 ((fee includes one complimentary ticket to the Preservation Awards Celebration)
- Upon payment a personalized One-Drive Link will be sent to upload the application and attachments.
- You can pay for multiple submissions and one link will be sent to you to upload all submissions. You will see multiple folders in your shared folder for each separate submission.
- Complete all nomination forms for each project you wish to submit.
 - Upload your final files to your One-Drive folder. You will be able to edit and update your submission until 5 pm on Friday, March 15th.
- **The submission payment deadline is 5 pm Wednesday, March 13th.**
- **The upload of nominations and attachments is 5 pm Friday, March 15th.**

Award Categories

Awards for Individuals or Organizations

Education: Recognizes individuals or organizations who contribute to the public's understanding, appreciation, and discovery of our historic resources and of historic preservation.

Preservation Champion: Recognizes individuals or organizations with long-term dedication to historic preservation and who have had significant influence in historic preservation within the Greater Cincinnati region.

Impact Award: Recognizes individuals, organizations, projects, or initiatives that have had a positive impact on preservation within the community.

Volunteer Award: Recognizes an individual who has given above and beyond their time and talent to further the mission of Cincinnati Preservation Association. *This award is chosen by Cincinnati Preservation Association Board of Trustees*

Awards for Building Projects

Preservation Excellence-Sustainability: Recognizes preservation projects that also incorporate appropriate conservation and sustainable treatments to lessen a building's environmental impact while preserving significant features that convey its historic significance. Projects must have been completed in the last 3 years.

Preservation Excellence- Commercial Project: Recognizes Commercial, Mixed -Use or Institutional projects that have been substantially restored or rehabilitated that while making alterations or additions have preserved features of the property that convey its historic value. Projects must have been completed in the last 3 years.

Preservation Excellence-Residential Projects: Recognizes Residential (single or multi-family) projects that have been substantially restored or rehabilitated that while making alterations or additions have preserved features of the property that convey its historic value. Projects must have been completed in the last 3 years.

Preservation Excellence-Institutional Projects: Recognizes Institutional Building projects, such as churches, public buildings, schools, that have been substantially restored or rehabilitated that while making alterations or additions have preserved features of the property that convey its historic value. Projects must have been completed in the last 3 years.

Preservation Excellence-Adaptive Reuse: Recognizes projects that have reused an existing building for a purpose other than which it was originally built or designed for and have done so while also incorporating historic preservation best practices. Work must have been completed within the last year. Projects must have been completed in the last 3 years.

New Construction/Infill: Recognizes projects that have creative design solutions for compatible infill buildings in historic contexts. Residential, commercial, and mixed-use buildings are all eligible. Projects must have been completed in the last 3 years.

Partners: List all architect, planning, construction, financial etc partners that should also be recognized with contact information (mailing email and phone).

Nominees may include community and neighborhood leaders and organizations, dedicated individuals, educational institutions, or non-profit institutions.

For the **Preservation Champion Award** nominee has contributed to and furthered historic preservation in Greater Cincinnati. Please describe examples of the nominee's creativity, leadership, dedication, investment, or other efforts. Nominees may include neighborhood and community leaders, businesses, nonprofit organizations, government leaders, journalists, and other dedicated individuals who have shown long-term continued dedication to using historic preservation in their work and to improve the community.
