

Rehabilitation:



1925 Vine Street: Renovation of one of OTR's oldest apartment buildings, prominently sited at Vine and Clifton, using historic tax incentives.



Feccheimer House: This high-style Desjardins & Hayward-designed Colonial Revival residence in the Uplands Historic District has been painstakingly restored, removing inappropriate alterations, reviving original finishes and recreating missing elements, including the garden and the original radiant heating system.



International Molders and Allied Workers Union Building: This locally uncommon example of the Art Moderne style, built in 1948 (Carl Schmuelling, architect), has been carefully renovated as office space, removing unsympathetic alterations, restoring original finishes and replacing inappropriate vinyl replacement windows with metal units similar to the originals.



Latta Rowhouse, 232 Elm Street, Ludlow: The Ludlow Historic Society completed the exterior restoration and interior renovation of an 1884 rowhouse on Elm Street, the city's main thoroughfare, including recreation of missing architectural features using digital scanning.



The Public Comfort Station: Walnut Hills Bar in converted public comfort station. The Comfort Station reopened in the summer of 2019. The separate Men's and Women's entrances have been maintained, and lead the patron to two unique bar experiences. Through the Women's entrance you enter the bright, open first floor which includes an outdoor patio. Through the Men's entrance you go downstairs, where patrons will find a more intimate basement lounge. Comfort Station serves beer, wine, and craft cocktails.



Union Terminal: The first comprehensive restoration in its history revitalizes a community icon and National Historic Landmark for future generations.

Alexis Liu: With no background in preservation, Ms. Liu put tremendous effort into preparing a historic district designation report for her neighborhood, Bella Vista Street in Bond Hill, and garnered support for the successful designation from neighbors.
